
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Pick Of The Week



he impressive opening of a new photography gallery called Light (see Good Times page) didn't go unnoticed by the competition, so this week sees exhibitions by Great Names in Photography. New work by *Irving Penn* at Stephen White, old work by *August Sander* at Simon Lowinsky, and almost all of the work by *Richard Avedon* at G. Ray Hawkins. Historically less entrenched but just as interesting are the posed allegorical photos by *Dianne Biell* at both LAICA downtown and Cirrus, or the amusing billboard and landscape juxtapositions by *Robert Landau* at Leopold Gold gallery. In a group show at Artspace, *Patrick Negatani*'s images stand out. They are long rectangles of reflected reality, partial perspectives of color and clouds. *Stephen Frailey* does some nice SX-70 still lifes. After all that, *Avery Denziger* (photo above) challenges the meaning of that great icon Art in a group show at the LACMA's Art Rental gallery. Also of note there land a refreshing break from photography) are the drawings of *Lene Rivkin*.
